The National Black Church Initiative Supports the Department of Justice's Investigation into Black Lives Matter and Salutes Sis Susan Woods for Her Work in Uncovering BLM's \$90 Million Issues

Washington, D.C. – The National Black Church Initiative (NBCI), a coalition of 150,000 African American and Latino faith communities, comprising 27.7 million members, supports the Department of Justice investigation of Black Lives Matter (BLM). Many African American church members and ministers have asked NBCI to look into BLM's \$90 million program because we were unable to see any of the money at work during and after the COVID-19 pandemic.

All of our letters and phone calls to BLM have gone unanswered to this day. No, this is not about choosing sides—as we do not support Donald Trump anywhere—but we do support accountability. This is why the Black Church is so proud of our sister Susan Wood, who works hard to uncover where BLM spends \$90 million to support the Black community and address stubborn problems like crime prevention and youth activities.
